### WHAT IS TITLE I?

Title I is a federally funded program that provides academic support to students in our elementary school. This year our Title I staff will provide reading, math and English as a Second Language services to those students that are referred by their classroom teachers. Title I reading interventions are offered in small groups in the Title I classrooms. Math services are provided mainly in the regular classrooms, with limited pullout for homework assistance. This is a fluid program that allows us to provide the extra help students need. When students no longer need extra support they are exited from Title I.

# Why are challenging kids challenging? A collaborative problem solving approach

Challenging kids are challenging because they're lacking the skills not to be challenging. If they had the skills, they wouldn't be challenging. That's because – and this is perhaps the key theme of the Collaborative problem solving model – **Kids do well if they can**. And because (here's another key theme) doing well is always preferable to not doing well (if a kid has the skills to do well in the first place).

This, of course, is a dramatic departure from the view of challenging kids as attention-seeking, manipulative, coercive, limit-testing, and poorly motivated. It's a completely different set of lenses, supported by research in the neurosciences over the past 30-40 years, and it has dramatic implications for how caregivers go about helping such kids.

When are challenging kids challenging? When the demands or expectations being placed upon them exceed the skills that they have to respond adaptively. Of course, that's when we all respond maladaptively: when we're lacking the skills to respond adaptively. Thus, an important goal for helpers is to identify the skills a challenging kid is lacking. An even more important goal is to identify the specific expectations a kid is having difficulty meeting (the conditions in which challenging behavior is occurring), referred to as unsolved problems...and to help kids solve those problems. Because unsolved problems tend to be highly predictable, the problem-solving should be proactive most of the time.



Our teachers and staff at Houghton Elementary are doing many things each day to help students learn skills, solve problems and do well. You may see your student coming home with orange tickets, charts or other tools teachers use to proactively communicate and give feedback to kids and families. Please feel free to communicate with us about how these things can be consistent with what you are doing at home.




### HALLOWEEN CELEBRATIONS
